Rev. Ross Writes...

Easter is coming! The Lectionary this week – the fifth week of Lent – has Jesus talking about the coming hour and being lifted on the cross. Next week is Palm/ Passion Sunday; Easter is coming! If you go by the sale of hot cross buns, it's been coming for months! And that speaks to the ongoing, annual conflicts between church and society around the celebration of the major festivals. Stable versus Santa, tomb versus eggs. For some it's a source of anger and a sign of disrespect. "You can't hand out eggs at church, even if they are a symbol of new life!" For others it's a source of humour. "Why are rabbits laying eggs?!" "Why are we celebrating spring when it's autumn?" In a culture so disconnected from Christian thinking, is there a middle ground where we can present the message of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection that recovers the symbols of new life in a more meaningful way?

The stories of Easter are dramatic and emotional, and many feel that theatre and street theatre form ways to get the message across. But public displays like Stations of the Cross or Easter processions with appropriately dressed and bloodied characters can be more harmful than helpful to telling the story. What works for people who already know the story and hold the faith, can be a subject of derision for those who have no connection to the story.

In the tradition of Jesus, the storyteller, who used the image of a seed being buried to produce a new plant to explain his death and the life that flows from it, maybe bush fire, and the new growth that follows, make a more appropriate set of symbols for death and resurrection. A way to connect with people's lived experiences and bring out a message of faith and hope. May we always be ready to find new words and new ways to convey what we believe into our culture and time.
