This week is Pentecost; also the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity; also Reconciliation Week, which is particularly poignant this year as it is 20 years since the walks for reconciliation. I had been aware of the significant of Sorry Day this year, but the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity had escaped me until I realised that there was a reason why my morning prayer podcast had been spending so much time in John 17, where Jesus prays for unity for his disciples down through history. As Jesus prays for us, so we too can pray for our Indigenous brothers and sisters, including the Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress, and the Bunurong people of the Frankston region.

I'm looking forward to the Pentecost service, with both congregations coming together. I encourage you to wear something **RED!** Admittedly, if you connect by phone, we may not SEE it, but it might still add to the setting in your home. If you can do so safely, perhaps also (or instead) have a **candle flame** burning somewhere nearby, a reminder of the presence of the Holy Spirit divided between us and among us.

UPDATING ZOOM

COVID-SAFETY OVERSIGHT GROUP

The latest edition of High Street Times, out now and available on our website under the NEWS tab, contains details about the establishment of the HSUC Covid-safety Oversight Group (CSOG), and the Principles established by the Church Council. The Group met on Wednesday afternoon. After reviewing the principles that we will follow and the latest advice from the Government and the Synod, the things that we have determined at this point include:

- 1. We are asking small groups to continue *not to meet* physically together indoors, either at the church or in homes, at least through June.
- 2. **No other community groups** are using our facilities at this stage. **We are beginning preparations** including signage, provision of sanitiser, and clarity around allowable numbers. We will be requiring any user groups to sign agreements regarding the conditions under which the facilities can be used. Group will be required to ensure that numbers are within limits, that those who are ill do not attend, and that contact tracing will be possible if necessary.
- 3. Jacqui will undertake a short course on Infection Control.
- 4. We will monitor whether we will be able to begin **Youth Group and Play Group** activities in term 3 i.e., no earlier than 13 July.
- 5. No groups will yet be allowed to use shared mugs, dishes or morning tea facilities; hall-hirers would need individuals to bring their own mug and thermos if necessary.

We have a great deal more to work through, and will be meeting regularly to monitor the situation and ensure that anything we do is done safely and in compliance with government requirements. This will be a long-term process.
