In recent weeks there has been a series of texts from Samuel which has focussed on David. First, we meet him as a shepherd boy who was anointed by Samuel. Then he dispatches Goliath with a pebble and slingshot. As time passes he becomes the King of Israel and finally King of the whole Jewish nation.

In today's reading there is peace across the land and David sits back to take his ease, and yet he is disturbed because the Ark of the Covenant which symbolises God's presence is still in a tent. His plan is to build a house fit for the Ark. He is planning his future to fulfill God's promise to him of being a great King by erecting such a fit house for the Ark.

The prophet Nathan, who initially thought it was a good idea, has a message in the night telling him that it wasn't. David's plan will have to wait for his son to bring to fulfilment. So he is told that he is not to do it. His choice is not the right choice.


In the Gospel, Jesus is far from at ease. He has sent the disciples off on a mission. Soon after learning of the murder of his cousin John the Baptist, they return elated and exhausted to find Jesus in the midst of a chaotic group of desperate people all wanting something from him.

Jesus has a choice. Does he accede to the demands of the crowd or deal with the other pressing problem which is his exhausted disciples? As we have heard, he chooses an attempt to gain some peace for himself and his disciples when he says, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." And yet they couldn't hide! "As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd."

This is a biting conundrum for anyone involved in any sort of ministry in 2021. Do we try to help everyone who comes to us needing help – or do we make space for ourselves and give ourselves a chance to recover so that we have the mental and physical capacity to help anyone into the future?

This is a question for Ministers, Church Councils and lay people alike! Often it is hard to understand the good news that Jesus Christ already is the Saviour of the world and we are not required to save it once more. What do you think? lan Cayzer
