JNC

In the process of preparing to call a new minister next year, the Church Council is nominating 6 people to be members of the "Joint Nominating Committee" (JNC). The JNC also includes 2 representatives from the broader Presbytery. While there are some other steps to go through in order to prepare a profile that reflects our vision and strategy for mission and ministry, it will be helpful to confirm our JNC members in the meantime. The names of the nominees were circulated recently. Given the current restrictions, the Church Council resolved to delay the ballot until August 22–29. Traditional service members will vote on approving the 3 names associated with the Traditional service, and Contemporary service members similarly with 3 names associated with the Contemporary service. Ballot papers will be available from 22 August, and may be filled out on that day or returned to the office at any time over the following week. If anyone cannot get to the office and wants to vote, they will be able to call Jacqui in the office with their vote. This will be explained further on August 22.
