HALL HIRING

The Church Council has adopted a new COVID-Safety plan, and has opened the hall and facilities for outside hiring groups so that:

- Essential support groups are able to meet, without checking vaccination status, with numbers limited by the 4 person per square metre rule
- Other regular groups are able to meet with no number limits but with the requirement that all attendees must be vaccinated or exempt
- We are not currently accepting most new or casual bookings from outside the church, until we have a new Office Administrator in place
