THE BACK PAGE

Celebrating Ruth

Over the last two weeks we have been following the story of Ruth, from the short Old Testament book of the same name. As we've heard, Ruth was from Moab; she was a foreigner who had married an Israelite who had gone over to Moab. On her husband's death, Ruth took the daring chance of being faithful to her mother-in-law, Naomi, who had been left without any children or grandchildren. They went to Israel, where Ruth sought refuge "under with wings of the Lord". There, by the grace of God, she met Boaz. As we left the story last week, he was going to discuss with a nearer relative to Ruth's late husband whether that relative was going to take up his obligation to marry Ruth, or whether he would transfer that right (or responsibility) to Boaz.

We'll follow that through today, but suffice it to say that in the first chapter of the gospel of Matthew, where Matthew gives "an account of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham", there are five women specifically listed in the line of fathers and sons stretching from Abraham to David to Joseph. One of them is Ruth, the foreigner from Moab who, in faith, sought shelter with God and with a faithful man of Israel.

The story of Ruth in itself clearly contains a message about faithfulness found among both Israelites and foreigners, through whom God works. The genealogy in Matthew's gospel further affirms this. Just as Jesus' mother Mary sings about the goodness of God who lifts up the lowly (Luke 1:46-55), Ruth, the foreigner and widow, can also sing God's praise.
