DISASTER RELIEF APPEAL

Australia has just come out of its hottest summer on record with rainfall well below average. Widespread drought and heatwaves have caused great hardship across much of the land, with crops failed or not planted, and farmers selling off precious breeding stock which are no longer able to be fed. Fires have devastated large areas in Tasmania, Victoria and NSW. In the wake of Cyclone Oma, monsoonal rain has caused extensive flooding in and beyond Townsville, causing losses to stock which – until that time – were being nursed through drought conditions.

The Uniting Church is in all these places and continually seeks to bring support and relief in disaster through its congregations, presbyteries and a range of ministries which reach out to people in need.

Launching a National Appeal, President of the Uniting Church Dr Deidre Palmer urged Uniting Church members to give generously to the National Disaster Relief Fund. This fund supports the work of disaster relief in every state and territory.

Invited to a wedding banquet

At the recent World Day of Prayer, the Bible reading was Luke's version of Jesus' parable of the wedding banquet. Jesus loved feasts, and he probably told various versions of the story. Today we hear one from Matthew. (Matthew 22: 1-14)

The King is giving a wedding banquet for his son, but those who were first on the invitation list didn't bother to come. So the king gets his servants to go and bring in everyone they could find to come and join the feast. In Luke's story, the focus is on bringing in the poor and the lame; in Matthew's version, all of the people who could be found are gathered in, both the bad and the good. It is clear that God's love and grace extends to all.

We are pretty comfortable with this story to that point – God is generous and loving and inclusive of all.

But pushed too far, there's a problem. God loves all people – yes. But does that mean that God wants people to stay exactly as they are? What about abusers, or those who commit hate crimes? God loves them – yes! But does God want them to continue in such patterns?

God loves all people, including the bad and the good, but the point of God's love is draw people to be transformed and healed in *their* loving, as well.

So the story in Matthew's gospel has an ending which we don't expect, but which actually makes sense. If someone rejects and refuses that kind of healing and transformation, rejecting that love and refusing to change, then they are indicating that they don't really want to stay at the banquet. If they won't dress for the wedding, what else can God do?
