Paul's letter to the saints in Rome

For the next few weeks, the Bible reading plan that we are following is going to give us a series of passages from Paul's letter to "all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints."

Romans is a particularly valuable letter because in it, Paul is writing to a church community which he did **not** establish. He expresses his love for them and his respect for the witness to God that they bear. Because he hasn't been to Rome before, he is obliged to say more about his own understanding of the good news of God reaching out to us through the faith of Jesus. He makes explicit how through Jesus, both Jews and Gentiles alike are welcomed into relationship with God through faith, in a way that the Law had been unable to achieve. The first eight chapters of Romans unpack that message; then chapters 9 to 11 speak of Paul's hope for the Jewish people who haven't recognised Jesus as Messiah but who by no means have been rejected by God; and then in chapters 12 to 16 Paul talks about how the faith of Jesus should be lived out in the community in love.

In that way it's a bit like Matthew's gospel, which begins with the stories of Jesus being affirmed as being beloved and blessed by God, and how even the poor in spirit, the meek, the mourning and those hungering and thirsting for justice (among others) are blessed by God, and then unpacks what it means to live out of the confidence of God's love.

So in starting with Romans 1 this week we are introduced to Paul, Rome, and gospel which shows how God does right by us, through faith.
