

<u>Listening</u>

It's good to be back! Over the last fortnight I've had a busy time at the Synod meeting, followed by some fun family celebrations in Mildura. I look forward to catching up more with stories from Somers, and other things that have been going on.

Today we have the story of Martha and Mary (Luke 10:38-42). Martha welcomes Jesus into her home; Mary sits at his feet and listens to him; Martha becomes distracted by the work that needed to be done; and Jesus commends Mary's choice to stop and listen.

Jesus talks about a well-grounded disciple as being one who "comes to me, hears my words, and acts on them." (6:47). The story of Martha and Mary immediately follows after the story of the Good Samaritan who showed love for his neighbour by his action. The two stories, side by side, demonstrate well-grounded discipleship.

Today's story highlights the value of making time to stop and listen, even in the midst of the activities of life and discipleship. Even when we know God's love for us it can be easy for us to get caught up in all the things that need doing or worrying about. The commandment to keep the Sabbath is an invitation to us to take time out and trust God with keeping the world going; to take regular time for resting, reading the Bible, praying, fellowship and hospitality together.

Much more could be said, and more qualifications offered, but rather than measure ourselves up against Mary and Martha why not just stop for a moment now and offer a prayer, knowing that God sits to listen for us.
