Worship beyond the superficial

Today we have readings from the first chapter of the prophet Isaiah and from Luke's gospel, the latter following on from Jesus' story of the man who was so busy building barns for himself that he forgot that all of life is a gift.

The Isaiah reading is shocking. Paraphrasing only a little, Isaiah depicts God saying "I hate your worship! Your songs bore me. I'm not impressed by your special services or your many prayers." It's hard to be comfortable on a Sunday morning in the face of that. Then the point becomes clear, as God says (paraphrasing again): "If you are ripping off the poor and failing to defend the vulnerable, why would I be happy with nice songs?! Learn to do good and seek justice...!"

In the gospel reading Jesus depicts God as longing to be generous. "God is pleased to give you the kingdom!" (So don't be anxious about hoarding possessions for yourselves). "God who gives the wildflowers their beauty cares for you!" (So don't worry about putting on an appearance).

Jesus paints a picture: "When you're paying attention to the good things of God-soaked living, God's desire is to come in, put on an apron, prepare a meal for you and share it at your table."

It adds up to God wanting the best for us, and wanting us to do better than the superficial. God loves us to the depths of our being. As we grow in the knowledge of God's deep love and care for us, we can relax our anxieties about hoarding security; we can be ready for those moments when God shows up and asks some generosity of us; and we can worship in joy and in truth.
