
FOR OUR PRAYERS:

The Back Page

Persisting for justice

The gospel reading set for today has Jesus painting a picture of a widow who had long been denied justice. She was clearly not one of the powerful people in the town. The power was held by the man who was the judge, and who, in Jesus' story, "neither feared God nor had respect for people."

The widow persisted in making her claims, and because of her persistence the judge eventually relented.

The book "No Friend but the Mountain" is written by Behrouz Boochani, an Iranian-Kurdish journalist who took the perilous voyage by boat to Australia to seek asylum, only to be held in a detention centre at Manus Island from 2013. He tells of the conditions of the detention centre, and the humiliating treatment that those detained there with him endured. The detention centre itself is now closed but he and others remain on Manus Island with few freedoms or options, and still being referred to in degrading terms in Australian politics, without respect. How do they even ask for justice?

Luke records Jesus' story of someone with no power, dependent on the decisions of others. The widow persists. Do we ignore her?

As Luke records it, Jesus finishes his story with the question, "But will the Son of Man find faith when he comes?" Or will we be so worn down by disappointment that we despair of justice, and fall from our prayers?
