
#### **FOR OUR PRAYERS:**

# **The Back Page**

#### All Saints Day

The biblical concept of a saint originally meant having God's stamp on you; being set apart for relationship with God. Michael Malone, in his book, First Lady, builds on this: giving a poetic understanding of a saint:

"What makes a saint? If stars are the light, then I'd say saints are people the light shines through. Not just the famous saints, ... but the everyday saints around us in the world. Light shines through them and illuminates what they see. The light just goes right through them to what they love so that we can see its beauty."

Today, we will consider the importance of saints: people who have shaped and enriched many lives – both ours and others; saints who continue to live as well as those who have died. Via Luke's Beatitudes, encouraged by the saints, we will be called to love our enemies, do good to those who hate us; and do to others as we would have them do to us.

High on the walls of St Gregory Nyssa Episcopal Church in San Francisco is a mural depicting over ninety dancing saints. (A group of them is on the front of today's Newsheet.) From them we will gain insights into how we, too, can become saints of God.
