

### The Back Page SONGS AND PRAYERS

Over the last few weeks, we have been listening for some of the various cultural voices within our congregation. Today, Australia Day, is the last day of that series. Some of you may be aware of a proposal by the Recognition in Anthem Project to update to the words of "Advance Australia Fair". In the first verse there is just one proposed word change: "for we are **one** and free". The proposed second verse beings with "For sixty thousand years and more" and speaks of uniting cultures and respect for the land. The third verse references how, in times of drought and flood and fire, Australians join with helping hands. What is this to us, the church, on this Australia Day? We have so much to be thankful for, including the cultural diversity with which we are blessed. We are sustained on this land with people whose ancestry here goes back tens of thousands of years, equally in the loving embrace of God. Any ways in which we can all walk better together with integrity and grace are worth pursuing, faithful to God's calling for us to honour all people and pursue peace (see eg. Romans 12).

Last week we sang the song "Lord of Earth and All Creation" (M.R. and H.M. Thwaites, Together in Song 672). The last verse makes a great prayer:

Lord, life-giving healing Spirit, on our hurts your mercy shower; lead us by your inward dwelling, guiding, guarding, every hour. Bless and keep our land Australia: in your will her peace and power.
