



The Back Page

Back Page

What a remarkable story Mark gives us today (see 5:21-43)! The healings of Jairus' daughter and an unnamed woman who has been haemornhaging for twelve years raise profound images and insights for us. Against prevailing customs, both Jairus and the woman placed their trust in Jesus

- Jairus, a leader in the antagonistic to Jesus Jewish community, came to him when his
 daughter was ill, nearing death, for help; and
- The woman, after years of being mistreated by doctors and excluded from society, having heard of Jesus, came and touched the hemof his cloak "If I but touch his clothes," she said, "I will be made well." And, she was made well.

What place does trust in Jesus play in your life? When life is tough, do you trust you will come through the struggle? How does faith come into your daily living?

The people and communities who have lived with the devastation of bushfires in this Australian Summer (and earlier) will find faith and trust helpful in their recovery. For some, it will be faith in Jesus. For some it will be relying on their inner resources or people coming alongside to help. For some, the signs of new life in nature will give them hope.

Through my involvements in Baimsdale and Sarsfield as one of the Victorian Council of Churches Emergencies Ministry team, I have been encouraged by the remarkable support of individuals and communities in fire ravaged East Gippsland. The working together of differently gifted people has touched and enlivened many hearts. Personally, to listen to people's stories has been privilege indeed, and trusting in God to give me what I need has been important as I listen and respond.

Jesus says to the women, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace." Then, Jairus is encouraged to retain his faith, even in the face of death, "Do not fear, only believe."

May faith and trust continue to rise up in you.
