FROM THE MINISTER

This month we enter the season of Lent. Starting on Ash Wednesday (26 February), Lent is 40 days of preparation leading up to Easter. It helps us to recall Jesus' 4 days of preparation for ministry, in the desert, during which he faced various temptations but stayed true to his calling and identity. For us, Lent can be a useful time of practicing some spiritual discipline, such as giving up some kind of treat or distraction. One Lent I gave up drinking tea! You may be aware that I drink quite a lot of tea, and so by giving up tea I was able to recalibrate my living, reminding myself that I don't need to depend on my 'fix' of tea first thing in the morning (as it's not a prescribed medication – I don't recommend giving up any of those for Lent!) When I would normally reach for a cup of tea, I was reminded to instead turn to God, and lean more deeply into my relationship with God. People seeing me on Sunday mornings wouldn't have been aware that I'd given up tea, since Sundays' are always feast days (the day of resurrection) and so I still drank tea at church! The point was to develop my own spiritual journey and practice a greater trust in God during that time, so really, no-one else needed to know.

Even if Lent has already begun by the time you read this, it is not too late to consider a Lenten discipline like this for the remainder of the time until Easter. And be aware that there's more value in giving up distractions than giving up treats, because the focus is not dieting, it's practicing and developing a deeper trust in God.

There are also several Lenten Bible studies being run, which have been advertised through the newssheets.

Also during March we have the church's Annual General Meeting, on March 15 between the services. This will include the elections of Elders and Church Councillors; please be sure to consider nominations so that we have breadth and wisdom from across the church represented. Elders are drawn from the Traditional congregation. The Contemporary Congregation is in the process of electing a new set of Contemporary Oversight Group (COG) members which looks set to include quite a few new people to the role. Church Council covers the whole life of the church, and so nominations from both the Contemporary and Traditional congregations are welcome.

As a final note, please pray for the gradually growing street outreach ministries. We are establishing connections with "Street Peace", which provides ministry among young people (teenagers); and we are supporting the development of "Street Chaplains", which is being led by our ecumenical contacts Mark Whitby and John Clements. Initial meetings are sounding promising! Pray for the right metaphorical doors to open at the right times!

Keeping Children Safe at High Street Uniting Church – An update!

Does High Street Uniting Church want to keep our children safe? Of course we do! That's why our congregation made a commitment to implement the Keeping Children Safe policy, which has been adopted by the Uniting Church at all levels. The basis of this policy is that all children who are involved in any of the Uniting Church in Australia's activities, services, events or programs have a right to feel and be safe. Further, that the Uniting Church in Australia is committed to provide safe environments where children are cared for, respected, nurtured and sustained.

To keep our children safe, we need safe leaders! That's why all our congregation members in leadership positions have been required to provide a current Working With Children Check. This includes everyone involved in children's activities, and also ministers, pastors, lay preachers, and other "leaders" such as elders, church councilors, worship leaders, music leaders and organists, and bible study leaders (even if they don't have direct contact with children). Our leaders have also all had Safe Church Training in relation to Keeping Children Safe policy and procedures, to ensure everyone is up to date and familiar with what is required of us from now and into the future.

In addition, there are new procedures for new volunteers coming into various "leadership" positions, including holding a current Working with Children's Check, and providing references who can confirm the person's suitability in terms of safety around children. This careful screening is something we need to keep in mind whenever somebody new commences in a particular role. The Guidelines for selecting new Volunteers will be placed on the noticeboard in the foyer near the church office for reference.

To keep our children safe, we need safe programs! That's why for all our children's activities, such as playgroup, Sunday School, and youth groups, there are procedures in place which are being followed including safety risk assessments, and ensuring appropriate parental permissions are received. Our Playgroup Co-ordinator, Emma, and Youth Co-ordinator, Hannah, are doing a great job with this.

The full range of information on policy and procedures for Keeping Children Safe and Working with Children Checks can be found on the Uniting Church Synod of Victoria and Tasmania website, <u>www.ucavictas.org.au/keepingchildrensafe</u>. We have also placed some of the important documents in a folder kept in the Church office if you would like to have a look at them there.




