PASSING THE PEACE with CLEAN HANDS

We have a very strong tradition of greeting each other, with a greeting of Christ's peace, as a part of both contemporary and traditional worship. And so we should! It's right to celebrate that in Christ we are one, and we are called to acknowledge, care for, and bless one another.

The way that we express that is, of course, entirely a product of our cultural tradition. In Maori culture people hold their noses together to share the same air; in European cultures kisses on the cheek are more common. I'm not at all sure what the variety of practices in Jesus' time might have been (although Paul mentions greeting each other with a brotherly kiss, in common English translation).

At the moment, there is anxiety around the community about the transmission of the coronavirus COVID-19. A very simple way of helping to reduce the possible transmission of any virus, and certainly to reduce anxiety about it, is to try a new tradition for this greeting for a while.

So let's try passing the peace with our own hands held together, prayer style, in front of our chests with our fingers pointing upwards, like the image on the front of the newssheet, with a slight bow of the head. This is similar to the customary Indian greeting of "Namaste", which means "I bow to you", though the posture may not be completely the same. We will still use our standard greeting of "Peace be with you" or "The peace of the LORD be with you", with the response "And also with you."

I will probably still shake a hand that is extended to me, but worship may offer us a good opportunity to practice greeting with less hand-touching, so that we can meet together in worship without anxiety, sharing Christ's peace.
