Greetings in Christ's name!

It's hard to believe that we've been worshipping "online" for 3 or 4 weeks now – or maybe not so hard to believe, when "how things used to be" seems like another world at the moment. I have been delighted with the amount of connection that we have managed to achieve in worship, particularly with the Traditional congregation connecting well to phone-based services, and the Contemporary service continuing to improve our participation together.

Following Jesus' way is not just about Sunday mornings; it is about living life in the Kingdom of God in all of our being. The situation in which we find ourselves now tests many of our edges. For some of us, time spent without lots of close human interaction is easy, and almost restful. For others, especially the more extroverted, the challenge runs very deep. For those who don't live alone this period may be less about isolation and more about learning to live in a situation where various personalities are under stress. For almost all of us, the greatest difficulty may be not being able to physically visit people we love.

The Bible is full of narratives and reflections because of the different experiences that God's people have faced through history, and the different responses drawn from God's people by the Spirit's call. Even in the early church life including significant trials, but we are encouraged that endurance produces character and hope, grounded in God's love, through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us (Romans 5:1-5).

Our worshiping together is one way of fostering our ongoing fellowship; encouraging one another through this period; and turning our hopes and our prayers to God, who is faithful, and sends the Spirit among us. And that's the story that begins in the book of Acts, which we'll be following in the coming weeks.
