Dear friends,

Thank you everyone at High St for your wonderful welcome, not just in the service on Sunday but in every greeting. Allow me now to introduce myself and Carmen.

Although this is only my second placement since I was ordained in 2014, I have almost 40 years of experience as a Lay Preacher throughout the old Presbytery of Barwon that also included doing Supply Ministry for 5 different congregations. I am a product of a Methodist family and church and certainly feel 'at home' in worship. By profession, I was trained as an engineer and worked for three different automotive companies in design and development, until the death of my first wife, and our daughter, led me to being a single parent of our two sons. I had a few years running a craft shop before becoming a caretaker for Wesley Uniting Church in Geelong. The undeniable call to ordained ministry came late in my life but not unwelcome and it was at college (United Faculty of Theology) that I met Carmen, who was in administration there.

Carmen comes from a German background and a Baptist heritage which just goes to show that the words I said about ecumenism and wider church at my Induction are ones that I live. Since our marriage, which was just before my Ordination, Carmen has trained as a Remedial Massage Therapist which she practises from home and intends to move her practice with us. Carmen has three daughters, all now into adulthood and independent living, and my two sons are now married and have given us three delightful grandchildren.

Outside of church, I have a long experience in non-professional theatre, beginning with Gilbert and Sullivan and progressing to dramas and comedies and directing. I am well aware of the similarities between theatre and church, but also respectful of the differences – a congregation is much more than an audience.

At my age I could be thinking of retiring but there are always new things to learn and share and I follow the adage that I'm not old, just 26 with 40 years' experience!

Nor did I open the wrapped gifts or the envelopes. Time was on my mind – with the first person for the Contemporary Service already in the narthex!

Ann and I both want to say thank you for the opportunity to lead worship over the 15 weeks. I have come to love preaching and the opportunity to help people hear what God has been saying through the Scriptures. I certainly enjoy the chance. The preparation helps me gain insights. The actual preaching helps me share what I believe God wants his people to hear, understand and be challenged by. And, by the way, we were delighted by the choice of gifts. You saw the yellow roses. You may not know that in her time at Geelong High School Ann was able to present the school with dozens of rose bushes she had won at the Geelong Rose Show! She loves roses – and our native garden. Equally she loved the two blocks of dark chocolate!

Not only did we receive those gifts and a carefully written card of appreciation, but a cheque for \$500 7

made out to the Mission Liaison Group.

We couldn't have been more delighted! Someone must have known what the MLG means to us. Already we had received renewed friendship – and more than enough for the time we spent with you. When I retired from 'active ministry' in 2005 and we returned to the house we'd purchased in South Frankston in 1995, it was not appropriate to come back to High Street. We joined The Village Uniting Church in Mount Eliza. Today it's our home congregation. But having seen many former friends here in High Street during this Interim Ministry – and having made new friends – we'll be back when it seems appropriate! Now is the time to consider being involved and completing training.

VCC Emergencies Ministry has continued to support people affected by numerous events during Covid and is now looking to make our service more resilient by retraining current volunteers and recruiting new volunteers.

The work done by volunteers during the 2019-20 bushfires was the most extensive undertaken and at one stage there were 14 relief



centres requiring volunteers extending from Corryong region to Mallacoota. Many volunteers from our congregations were involved and did wonderful work helping to support those affected.

As we go to press we are saddened with the news that our dear friend Ruth Poole passed away after a long illness. Our thoughts and prayers go with Arthur, Kerry, Russell and their families at this time. The funeral will be at 11:00 am on Monday 10th October at the church.

The work of the Woman and Child Community Health Project (JBKS) in North India continues

As India is now in the 'moderate' category level for COVID-19 (according to the CDC) Dr Alma Ram and her team have returned to sharing their community health advice and knowledge in the Punjabi villages.

First was a meeting in Majitha with the widows and single women teaching on widows' pensions and noting the amount and also about caring for each other.

Alma says: "I shared the newspaper article of an abducted girl on the way home from school during the last two weeks. Discussed how it happened and what to watch out for with daughters and granddaughters.

Then we discussed the death of children through diarrhoea. I explained death happened due to dehydration. Fluid is important. Clean water, salt and sugar. Advised to feed the child each time and when morning comes take to doctor. Lastly, we discussed the need to learn from each other."



The second meeting was at Shikaar Masiar. The meeting was at 2pm. Unfortunately three routes to the area had a traffic jam so we arrived at 3.30pm. Only two women were still there. Still the other ladies returned. The meeting was for widows and older women and we shared on the latest abductions. Then due to so many diarrhoea deaths explained this can help if this happens when Dr or money is unavailable - teaspoon of sugar and 3 finger pinches of salt in boiled cool water (I brought things to demonstrate). The ladies began whispering that doctors give this in hospital. So a good month for JBKS. Helen Beeby
