# HIGH STREET UNITING CHURCH NEWS 30 November 2020

#### Dear friends,

The Israelites spent 40 years in the wilderness, between the time when they were rescued from their slavery in Egypt (and the plagues!) and their entry into the Promised Land. We are also on the long road, but with the vistas starting to open out again. During the Traditional worship this week we will have a reading from the beginning of Joshua, as the Israelite prepare to enter the new land, and a thanksgiving from Psalm 107. We aren't quite in the Promised Land yet – our ways of meeting remain remain limited for now – but it's a relief to get past the hard lockdown stage and for the community to have achieved such success in suppressing the pandemic here.

Meanwhile, during the Contemporary Worship this week we will be especially praying for year 12 students. The service will include significant leadership by the young people and will have some good creative aspects for people to participate in as they feel able – there's a note about that below.

For both services this week we will be sharing in Holy Communion, <u>so please have with you a piece of</u> bread and a small drink (wine, grape-juice, or whatever you can manage) if you would like to share in this way.

#### NOTE FOR CONTEMPORARY WORSHIP (Not the 9am service)
