Deakin University Study

Over the last month, our readings from Luke's gospel have challenged us to consider how we care for our neighbours. Jesus challenged the people in Nazareth by pointing out that God's care extends beyond the 'local' culture, to people from across the nations.

In consideration of that, we are starting a new initiative of a Social Justice group at the church, spurred particularly by the recent attention drawn to people in long-term detention in Melbourne's Park Hotel. The Asylum Seeker Resource Centre has the following comments on their website, where there is a petition you can sign (<u>https://action.asrc.org.au/</u>)

...For the past seven years, successive governments have enacted harmful policies against people seeking asylum, including the indefinite detention of everyone who arrived by boat after 19 July 2013.

Today, there are still 200 people held against their will in Papua New Guinea and Nauru. Over 1000 women, men and children have been transferred to Australia for critical medical treatment and now live in 'transitory' visa limbo.

75 of those people are held in locked immigration detention centres and so-called 'alternative places of detention', such as the Park hotel prison.

Countless Parliamentary and Departmental inquiries, UN investigations, reports by the Australian Human Rights Commission, and numerous whistleblowers, including the government's own doctors have repeatedly told us the same story of systematic abuse, violence and medical neglect of people held in detention facilities. Tragically, 13 people have died in these centres.

If you would like to join the Social Justice group to help us to make a response to this situation, please contact me or go the first meeting of the group, which will be on **Thursday 3 March at 7:30pm** in the Blue Room at the church.

More locally, StableOne is working on bringing the Winter Shelter initiative to Frankston. Winter Shelter involves arranging for 7 churches to provide accommodation for homeless people, one night a week each, over the three months of winter. To support this, a number of volunteers are required on a regular basis to assist with the provision of meals (dinner and breakfast), with set-up and pack-up, and with supervision. While our church and hall may not meet the requirements for safely housing people overnight, we can still assist with the provision of volunteers. - Countries fairly share responsibility for supporting survivors of displacement.

3. Reduced displacement

Working to reduce the number of people forced to flee their homes.

The programs and advocacy initiatives we support aim to ensure:

- Communities lead initiatives to reduce the impact of disasters and other displacement drivers.
- Governments and the public take strong action to reduce conflict and climate-driven displacement.
